QUINTET OF THE AMERICAS RECIEVES CHAMBER MUSIC AMERICA RESIDENCY GRANT

Quintet of the Americas has been awarded a 2008-09 Residency Partnership Program Grant by Chamber Music America.



The program description says that the grant, "enables ensembles and presenters to bring live ensemble music to rural, urban, and suburban

communities nationwide. Dynamic collaborations and non-traditional partnerships among ensembles, presenters, and community-based organizations are encouraged."

The Quintet has already begun collaborating with and presenting concerts at the New York Hall of Science in Queens' Flushing Meadows Corona Park and with several other borough locations such as Jackson Heights, Flushing and Jamaica. Many more concerts will come as part of this grant. Funding for this grant has been provided by the JPMorgan Chase Residency Grant Program, a program of the JPMorgan Chase Foundation and the Chamber Music America Residency Endowment Fund.

The Quintet has released a gorgeous new CD – **Sounds of Brazil**, on the MSR label (MS1279).
